Summer Mission Appeal Next Weekend

Sr. Leonore Coan, SNDdeN will speak on behalf of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur ministries in Africa and Latin America on August 29 and 30.

She will tell the Notre Dame story from personal experience throughout countries in Africa and Latin America. The financial appeal that she will make is on behalf of the ministry needs in evangelization, education, pastoral and health care.

The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, were founded in 1804 by Marie Rose Julie Billiard, a French peasant woman. The vision and hope of St. Julie Billiard was that her sisters would go throughout the world, proclaiming God's loving care for all peoples. Today, the Sisters of Notre Dame serve in Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America and the United States. Throughout their long history as an educational order they have always emphasized the care of those living in poverty in the most abandoned places. They are women of courage and faith, unafraid of the personal cost of the living out of the Gospel. They stand with the poor through a diversity of educational ministries at all levels of society.

Next weekend we will welcome the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur to our parish. Our prayers, encouragement, and the collection which will be taken up join our parish in a very particular way with the mission of this religious congregation of Sisters. Let us be as generous as we can.

"Solidarity in Faith"

When Bishop LaValley twined our Diocese with the Maronite Diocese of Latakia in Syria he made it clear that this initiative would be called "Solidarity in Faith". For some guidelines to help us understand some principles which would apply to our relationship with Latakia, the introduction that Catholic Relief Services has in their "Parish Partnership Manual". discussed Principles of Solidarity-based Partnership and From Helping to Solidarity. So I quote from the manual:

"This model is rooted in the belief that we all have much to give and receive by being in a relationship with a Diocese with a reality very different from our own, and that our relationship offers the whole Diocese an opportunity to grow deeper in faith and solidarity with our sisters and brothers in another country and by extension with all God's children around the world, as a response to our Gospel call to be One in Christ."

The Document states further: "A true partnership implies the building and nurturing of a relationship over a period of time that transcends one act of working together, or of sending a series of checks. If the partnership is based solely on resources, then the partner with few material resources is excluded from full and mutual participation. When a relationship is itself highly valued, it allows for mutual participation and transformation, and all are invited to participate equally, as we all have the ability to love and to pray and to be present to one another."
