June 10 and 11 marks the combined Catholic Communication Campaign and Catholic University Collection. ### **Most Sacred Heart of Jesus**

Today (Sunday) we celebrate Pentecost and the Friday that follows the Second Sunday in Time after Pentecost is the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, which will be on June 23.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

"It is in the eleventh and twelfth centuries that we find the first unmistakable indications of devotion to the Sacred Heart. Through the wound in the side, the wound in the Heart was gradually reached, and the wound in the Heart symbolized the wound of love." [Catholic Encyclopedia]

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back to the 11<sup>th</sup> century. But through the 16<sup>th</sup> century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first Feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal. The "great apparition," June 16, 1675, (the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi), is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France.

Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church.

It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord...the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi, or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday..
